

Hello to all the PSR members from the NMRA Arizona Division.

We are continuing our regular schedule of meets and events in the summer and fall. On June 18th, our summer meet was held in the cool mountain air of Prescott. We had about 40 members attending, including NMRA members from as far away as Yuma. An NMRA member from San Diego attended whose SPNG HOn3 train won the Best of Show award. We also added two new Rail Pass members to our chapter. Three clinics were presented including a history of the Santa Fe, Prescott and Phoenix Railroad, Why Model Trains Derail (And what to do about it) and Modeling Railroad Fire Trains. Our latest monthly Zoom meeting was conducted on August 20th. Bruce Petrarca, our Division AP manager gave a presentation on the AP program and how to complete the AP paperwork. Our fall meet is scheduled for Saturday, November 19th in Tucson.

Our chapter members continue to earn points towards their MMR designation. With Bruce's help and encouragement, I recently submitted my application for the Golden Spike Award. I'm not sure I have the time to work towards the MMR designation, but I clearly understand how going through the program sharpens your modeling skills.

Planning is well along for the 2023 PSR convention, hosted by the Arizona Division. The Grand Canyon Special will be held in Flagstaff, AZ on June 7-11, 2023. Please visit our table at the PSR convention in San Diego on September 7-11 for more information and to register. Flagstaff is in northern Arizona at an elevation of 6,910 feet. The surrounding Coconino National Forest is the largest contiguous ponderosa pine forest in North America. Nearby scenic highlights are Sunset Crater, the San Francisco mountains and of course, the Grand Canyon. The host hotel is the Drury Inn and Suites with the convention activities in the adjacent High County Conference Center on the campus of Northern Arizona University.

We are planning a full schedule of clinics on model railroad and non-model railroad topics plus layout tours. We have arranged with the Grand Canyon Railway to host a tour of their shops on Friday of the convention and run a special excursion train on Saturday behind steam locomotive #4960 for NMRA members and guests. The excursion train will offer four classes of service, with a two-hour layover at the Grand Canyon and photo run-by on the return trip. We hope to see you in Flagstaff next June.

Last quarter, I shared L.A. was about to initiate Division sponsored bi-monthly home layout visits. And remember you ARE NOT competing against other entries in the room but just against yourself and the evaluation criteria.

PSR Treasurer

During the period May 1, 2022 through July 31, 2022, with the exception of one payment of \$25.00 California State registration fee and a \$31.00 stop payment fee, all other transactions were related to the initial funding of the work for the NMRA National Convention which will be hosted by PSR in 2024. The PSR Board of Directors voted to provide \$10,000.00 in "seed" money to the 2024 Convention Committee. A portion of these funds (\$4,117.99) were disbursed via the PSR checking account for immediate needs prior to the creation of a separate National Convention bank account. The balance of the \$10,000.00 "seed" money (\$5,882.01) was transferred directly into the new Convention Account as the initial account deposit.


There was one deposit of \$9.62 during this period, reflecting the proceeds from Amazon Smile.

The July 31, 2022 Bank Statement indicates that the Region has \$22,228.91 (compared to \$32,463.29 on May 1, 2022) in the Region Checking Account.

Additionally, the Bank Account paperwork was updated to remove and replace a number of signers and authorized individuals, as directed by the Board of Directors.

"The Tidewater and Western Railway"

After almost thirty five years "The Tidewater and Western Railway" is now just a memory, but for those fortunate to have visited it the memory will last forever.

Not to worry, Robert Olds is still well but due to mobility issues he had to move out of his condominium in Newport Beach which housed "The Tidewater and Western Railway." This once thriving railroad empire is now just an empty basement room with the layout filling two trash dumpsters. Through Bobs generosity all the structures, locomotives and cars were salvaged by the Cajon Division and will be used as Hobo Auction items at future meets, Thank you Bob.

A brief history of the Tidewater and Western Railway, construction started shortly after Bob moved to Newport Beach in 1978 with the digging of a basement under the condominium. The majority of the mainline completed by May 1992 and the majority of the layout completed in December 1998. But like any railroad they are never finished, and Bob continued to add details. The layout has been on numerous tours by various groups over the years and for a full description of how the layout was built see an article in the Summer 2018 edition of the Cajon Division Order Board on the Cajon website. Well worth reading and some great photos.

Over the years I have visited the layout and enjoyed talking about the layout with Bob. But never had hours of time to really look at the intricate details on Tidewater and Western Railroad. I was one of several members from the Cajon Division who assisted Bob in the removal of the layout, and what I found uniquely interesting was the insight Bob had in making each scene on the layout tell a story. On one of the branch lines there was an orange grove with a small farmhouse, people in the process of picking oranges for shipment from the nearby packing house. In the city there was a street of houses and each one of them told a story, a family having a back yard BBQ, another doing yard work and one with kids playing in the front yard and an old woman chasing them off with an umbrella. At City Hall what appeared to be a Fourth of July celebration, with a crowd of people and of course a politician making a speech. In a back corner of the layout was a work train with a section crew getting ready to do some track maintenance, and a little farther down the track a cattle ranch with a corral and loading ramp. On the river a dad with his boys fishing, hikers in the woods, and passengers at the station looking for the next train. No matter where you look you saw some type of human activity.

Bob understood that a model railroad is far more than just watching a train run around the tracks, and his interpretation of the real world on the "Tidewater and Western Railway" was uniquely refreshing.

Bob, thank you for sharing your unique talents with the model railroad community for all those years, the "Tidewater and Western Railway" will be missed by all, and I was one of the many blessed by being introduced to your rare talents.

How Does the Pacific Southwest Region benefit?

Each quarter the PSR NMRA will receive an electronic funds transfer from Amazon for the total of the donations during the prior period. I personally do quite a bit of shopping online and I just recently switched my contribution over to the PSR NMRA once we achieved our 501 c (3) designation.
