





The San Diego Division continues to experience more activity and participation since adding mini-meets and increased mailings. Particularly effective are the "week of" postcard reminders. This layout was featured in the September 2002 issue of Model Railroader. Another well done N scale layout, although of a more modest size, the 7'x8' layout by Charles Baker depicts the Cascade region of the country based on Ron Johnson's Washington Cascade layout featured in the October 2000 issue of MR. Prominent is the Nuclear Power plant hinting at Charles' profession as a Nuclear physicists. November saw our Winter Meet hosted by the Poway All Scale Club which included clinics, an auction, contest, and of course, food. In December we were treated to another outstanding HO layout, the Coyote Pass and Northern by Dick Trotter. This is not only a superb example of modeling, but an operational dream. Another eventful year has passed. There is no doubt that time passes more quickly as one gets older.

I hope many of you read Randy Lee's editorial regarding competition, in the last column. It is hard to believe that we are losing our competitive spirit, and along with it our competitive edge. However, there is much evidence to support this contention.

If you are contemplating entering NMRA® contests, there is plenty of assistance available. The PSR is blessed with some excellent division contest chairpersons. Additionally, I, as the PSR Contest Chair, am available. Help is accessible, you need only to ask.

An excellent place to get started in the NMRA® contest process is on the division level. Entering division contests can be fun and educational. You'll learn what to do and what not to do. Division competition will prepare you for bigger and better things.

Entering regional contests is the next step. You'll generally find that the competition on this level is a little more intense with more models being entered. The model quality is usually higher than those entered in division contests. One reason for the higher quality can be attributed to the lessons learned from participating in division contests. Models can be improved by reviewing the various categories and judges' criticisms and correcting any deficiencies that may have been noted by the judges. Additionally, it will give you better insight in preparing documentation to support your modeling efforts.

The next logical step is entering the NMRA® national contest. There is a certain indescribable feeling when viewing your model on the table with all those others, many created by some of the finest modelers in the NMRA®.

Some opine that those who enter contests are on an "ego trip". During my considerable time in the contest room, I've seen very, very few of these so called egotists. Through my personal experience in entering and judging contests, I've been able to hone my skills and elevate my modeling to new levels. Improving one's skills has nothing to do with ego.

Test your skills. Ask questions. Enter NMRA® contests. Learn. Regards, *Duane*

2004 Convention Update

Here's a summary of the events that will take place at the 2004 PSR Convention in Glendale this September. Currently, there are over 30 clinics planned that cover many modeling subjects and prototype information. There are also some very special and unique clinics in the works.

In addition a special night on Friday, September 17th, will feature a slide show by Bob Larson. Bob is an author, world traveled photographer, and retired railroad engineer. He will share his adventures and part of his collection of 50,000 slides. The show will concentrate on western railroads and the unusual and different from around the world. His humorous tales as an engineer makes this a show you don't want to miss.

Thursday evening will also be special when Jan Wescott and her Cajon crew presents an auction night. It will start with a live auction with plenty of surprises, lots of fun, door prizes, and refreshments. The evening will end with an exciting white elephant auction. So get those items together you want to get rid of, and either bring them to the live auction to make a few bucks, or wrap them in newspaper to donate to the white elephant auction.

So far there are in excess of 30 home and club layouts, from 'N' to 1-1/2" scale, for your viewing pleasure. All of the layouts will be reasonably close to the convention hotel and complete, easy to follow maps and directions will be provided.

Three prototype tours have been arranged so that you can travel on diesel and electric powered trains or on a vintage train. The biggest tour will be a bussed trip to Fillmore, in Ventura County. There you will ride the vintage Fillmore & Western train through the orange groves along the Santa Clara River to Santa Paula. The electric train tour of the subway and new Pasadena line will be on Thursday, the diesel train to downtown Los Angeles on Friday, and the vintage train all day Saturday.

The non-rails (Railettes) won't be left out as they will have their own hospitality room with clinics, bingo, crafts, & refreshments. They will also enjoy a complementary luncheon on Friday. Maps will be provided that show all

the dozens of restaurants that are within walking distance of the convention hotel. The huge Glendale Galleria is also a short distance away. Maps will also be available that show all of the interesting places to visit, from floral gardens and museums to Hollywood studios and shopping opportunities. There will be maps to all the model shops in the area as well.

Then on Saturday and Sunday there will be a large Train Show across the street from the hotel that will feature modular layouts, vendors, and tons of free stuff.

And of course there will be a Hobo breakfast next door to the hotel on Saturday morning plus a gala awards banquet on Saturday night with railroad entertainment.

We plan to have door prizes for all registrants plus door prizes for the members meeting on Sunday morning.






