Here are some hints for preparing your contest models:

- 1. Obtain a copy of the Judges' Score Sheet. By studying this sheet, you will get an idea of what the judges will be looking for.
- 2. Another good idea is to maintain a log, during the construction phase, to record the steps taken during the building process. Be sure to list the materials used. This will serve as a reminder of what you did and will aid you in filling out the Judges' Score Sheet.
- 3. Gather documentation such as photos and plans/drawings to present with your entry.

In filling our the Judges' Score Sheet, the goal is too describe what you hoped to accomplish and the process you used to accomplish that end.

As always, I stand ready to assist you with any contest issues or problems you may encounter. You need only to ask.



IN DEFENSE OF AMTRAK

While many railfans and modelers seem to delight in trashing AMTRAK, the railroad does offer our only national passenger rail operation, and is constantly under attack from the politicians. Following is a letter that Don Fowler, Director of the San Diego Division, sent to TRAINS Magazine. You may find it interesting reading. Ed.

Over the years, I have read numerous articles in your publication and others describing the financial mismanagement of Amtrak, its poor operation, and unsavory personnel. I thought that your readers might find my recent experience refreshing.

On the occasion of my son's graduation from the Great Lakes Naval Training Center, I decided that it provided the perfect opportunity to travel by Amtrak. I departed San Diego on August 9, 2006 and traveled to Los Angeles via Amtrak's Surfliner. The train was clean, the personnel were friendly and professional, and the train was on time (to the minute) throughout the trip.

At LAUPT, I transferred to Amtrak's Southwest Chief which departed approximately one hour late. Upon boarding, the sleeping car attendant apologized for the delay, escorted me to my room, and ensured that I had everything that I needed. Shortly after departure, I enjoyed a great dinner in the dining car that was served by friendly and jovial staff. After dinner, movies were shown in the Sightseer Lounge. When I returned to my room, my bed had been made up.

By morning, the delayed departure time had been made up and we were on time for the remainder of the trip. I awoke to fresh coffee, juice, and a newspaper. At Albuquerque, we were permitted to disembark during the service stop. Native Indians displayed and sold blankets, jewelry, and other art. Volunteers from the National Park Service boarded the train and provided information about the area we were passing through to passengers in the lounge.

Meals were always a pleasant adventure. The menu provided variety and the portions were plentiful and quite tasty. The dining car staff offered suggestions and made accommodation for special diets and finicky children. I dined with retirees, students, and families, most of whom were enjoying their first train trip. Complaints were few and usually resulted from inexperience in traveling by rail.

Upon arrival in Chicago on August 11, I was met by a Red Cap who offered to drive me and my luggage from my sleeping car to the station. To my surprise, he drove me right up to the rental car counter to pick up my car which had been pre-reserved through Amtrak. I obtained my car and proceeded to my destination.

The return trip departing Chicago on August 14 was just as good. As I got in line to check in, an Amtrak employee met me, examined my ticket, and escorted me to the Metropolitan VIP Lounge. There, I was checked in and enjoyed a movie on a big screen TV in a comfy chair with complimentary sodas and snacks. The train again departed approximately one hour late and the time was made up by morning.

On the return trip, I found the staff, food, and accommodations just as good as the first trip. In New Mexico, a passenger medical emergency caused a thirty minute delay while the train waited for an ambulance. The crew was professional and proficient throughout the ordeal. Although we arrived in Los Angeles on August 16 about thirty minutes late, I easily made my Surfliner connection and returned to San Diego without incident.

My wife tells me that I am frequently impatient with poor service and delays so if things had not gone well on my trip, I would

be letting you know about it. I can honestly say that the crews on both trains worked very hard to make my Amtrak experience as pleasant as possible. I regret that I cannot remember their names to give them the individual recognition they deserve. The trip was very relaxing



and the views of passing scenery were spectacular.

I recognize that not all Amtrak trips go as perfectly as this one but my experience was very good. We will soon be booking a trip to Seattle on the Coast Starlight for next summer. If you haven't taken an Amtrak trip lately, give it a try. You won't be disappointed.

And no, I don't work for Amtrak or the railroad industry.
