

level of the NMRA as a whole is not increasing, this is not indicative of growth. This isn't of concern only to the PSR, of course, but to all parts of the NMRA. Like all volunteer based organizations, getting and keeping members falls upon each member doing their part to attract new members, make them feel part of a great organization, and get them more involved in the hobby of model railroading. That means that you are as important to the PSR as anyone, and the PSR depends on you to do your part. Generally, that means getting involved in your Division activities, offering your assistance to others in the hobby (member or not), and getting new people into the hobby.

Finances are related to membership, of course, since dues and subscriptions to the PSR Dispatch help pay for our activities. However, another important resource in the past has been the annual PSR convention, which shares any "profits" from the convention between the hosting Division and the Region. Some years the conventions have been very successful, which helps both the Division and the Region. The past few years have not been as good (for various reasons), and it is time for us to look at the Conventions, how they are run and financed, and what can be done to make them both a better experience for the members, and financially successful. This has been a matter of discussion at the Board of Directors meetings, and you will see further activities in this area.

If you haven't heard yet, the 2008 NMRA Convention will be in Anaheim July 13 - 19, 2008, with the Los Angeles Division acting as the hosting Division. Contest Corner

There were considerably fewer entries in the Model Construction Contest and the Photo Contest when compared to last year's record and near record number of entries. However, there was a fair representation in the different model categories. The number of module entries was higher than usual.

Here is a breakdown of the different contest groups. Fourteen models were included in the judged Model Construction Contest. There were five models in the "Display Only" group and one model was entered in the popular vote, "Favorite Model" contest, only. Three modules were entered in the Module Contest and all three received merit award scores. There was a single entry in the Arts and Crafts Contest. A total of 24 entries were submitted for the Photo Contest. Of the 14 entries in the Model Construction Contest, six received merit award scores. The highest score of the day was for a cross stitch needlework entry in the Arts and Crafts Contest. Carolyn Weber's gem received a score of 123 out of a possible 125 points. Congratulations, Carolyn.

Over the years, I've entered and judged in a good many contests from the division to the national level. During this period I've noticed that there is a common denominator that consistently produces higher scores in Model Construction Contests. That common factor is the early preparation of the Entry Form and, especially, the Judges' Score Sheet. Many persons wait until they enter the contest room to fill out these required forms. They struggle to recall the details of just what they did during the model building process. This often results in a very sparse description of what was accomplished and the omitting of many important items that would have produced a higher score. If you are building a model that you may wish to enter in a future contest, you should maintain a log or set of notes on the construction process. This will provide a ready reference for what you did and how you did it as an aid for filling out the Judges' Score Sheet. It helps to list the details added to the model, scratchbuilt parts, anything that may be unique with regard to construction techniques or an uncommon feature.

Another good plan for a contest model is to take photographs of the different stages of the construction process. You may have the best detailed model in the

The Board of Directors of the PSR met for their semiannual Board meeting at the Al Bhar Temple, San Diego, CA, on October 11, 2006 with the President, Vice President and all four Division Directors present.

The Treasurer reported revenue has been declining, but because of fiscal responsibility the PSR has managed to operate with a positive cash flow. The proposed budget for 2006/2007 was submitted by the Treasurer and approved by the Board showing a \$20.00 surplus.

The Board approved revised copies of the Manual of Operations and By-Laws as submitted by Harold Graebner - Chairman By-Laws & Manual of Operations. Changes were necessary in order to be in compliance with the NMRA and

The 2007 PSR Convention Committee is pleased to extend this invitation to all PSR Members. We are working to prepare a memorable convention for each and every one of you.

Wednesday will start with the PSR BOD Meeting at 1:00 PM. Registration will open at 5:00 PM. There will be 51 hours of clinics over three days. Additionally, there will be three 5-hour "Modeling With the Masters" (MWTM) clinics and one 2-hour MWTM clinic.

There will be several layouts to visit over the five days, with some special operating sessions being planned for Wednesday evening.

There will be at least one special interest tour to the ASARCO Mineral Discovery Center – a modern open pit mine. A prototype tour will visit the Port of Tucson, Arizona Rail Car, Arizona Freight Car and a Concrete Tie Plant. There will also be several other tours that you can take on your own.

The Railette Program will include: Four craft projects per day, one clinic, a luncheon on Friday and a space limited nature hike (sign up when you arrive).

A full slate of contests will be offered with entries starting Thursday morning and ending Saturday morning. Judging on Saturday late morning and awards will be presented at the Banquet.

Friday night will feature a Chinese Auction, a social event for all who participate. Plan on having fun and perhaps obtaining that model you always wanted.

The Company Store will be open throughout the convention where you can pick-up your door prizes and purchase the convention car, convention patch and extra pins if you so desire.

The convention car will be a hopper, in keeping with the theme of copper and the railroads. The car will be available as a kit or RTR. The RTR car will be available in three styles, 1. Built-up, 2. Built-up plus weathering, 3. Built-up, weathered plus a load. Loads will also be available in the Company Store. A special load may also be available in the Company Store.

Saturday will start with the traditional HOBO Breakfast and end with the Awards Banquet. Current plans call for Jake Jacobson of the Copper Basin Railway to be the guest speaker at the dinner.
