



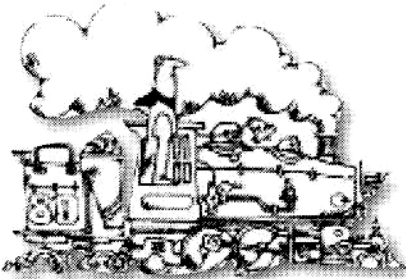

1. Score 100 points if you ever called in sick to finish a model.

11. Score 25 points for every kit you have purchased in the last year. Score 250 bonus points for every project you have completed.
12. Score 50 points if you're left-handed.
13. Deduct 300 points if you ever sold some of your unbuilt kits.
14. Score 30 points for every non-modeler who has seen your models and said, "Oh, I used to do that when I was a kid."
15. Deduct 100 points for every unfinished project you've set aside.
16. Score 500 points if you ever purchased a Mascot figure. Score 800 bonus points if you painted it. Deduct 1000 points if you did anything weird after that.

Another year is upon us. This year brings a special event to our region with the PSR hosting the NMRA national convention in Anaheim. There are some fine modelers, photographers and crafts persons in the PSR and this is a great opportunity to showcase their skills.

Once again, I would like to remind you that there will be a dual contest format in Anaheim. PSR member entries that have not previously received best-of-show or first place awards in regional competition will be eligible for both regional and national awards. There will be many opportunities to win awards with a two contest process.

During the Anaheim even, PSR member entries will have to be identified with a coding system to ensure that they receive the appropriate consideration for eligible regional awards as well as national awards. This applies to model construction, photo and arts and crafts contests. There will be the usual PSR contests with favorite model and levity awards. Ingenuity and the PSR President's awards will also be presented.

The contest room schedule is 8 AM-7 PM on Monday and Tuesday. Judging will be conducted on Wednesday and the awards will be presented on Thursday morning.

Let's go over some of the important hints for contest entries. Fill out the entry forms and Judges Score sheets prior to entering the contest room. Type in the information on the forms if at all possible. Include documentation, i.e. photos, plans, drawings, etc. Remember, conformity points are "gimmee" points with pertinent documentation. If you are entering a piece of rolling stock or motive power use a display track to enhance the presentation of your model.

Twice in this decade we have had 40 or more entries in a PSR convention contest. Last year it was reported that there were 45 entries in the national model construction contest at Detroit. Let's have a great turnout in Anaheim that demonstrates the pride that we have in our PSR organization with a large number of contest entries. Let's set an example for other NMRA organizations and members to emulate.

23. Score 350 points if, lacking reference, you ever "invented" a detail on a model, and passed it off as 100% accurate.
24. Score 75 points if you use different "mood music" for different modeling projects.
25. Score 250 points if you ever found someone else's drool on one of your models.
26. Deduct ALL YOUR POINTS if you actually scored yourself. You should be in there building models, not using your valuable time taking frivolous quizzes!

Member of the Year Awards

Each year a member is nominated from the each Division as "PSR Member of the Year", and one member of the Region is nominated for the "PSR President's Award".
