Not being a Lionel collector myself (although like many, I started model railroading with Lionel) I would like to see more scale equipment available from the various independent vendors and maybe a little less 3-rail, but, hey, that is just me. The interesting thing was that the interest level around our NMRA tables was up significantly from previous years and we actually signed up two or three new members on Saturday alone. I talked with several recent retirees who were looking to get "back into" the model railroading hobby. We are not currently able to process credit cards in our Cajon Division so I ended up sending a couple of guys home with an application that I am sure will also sign up. It makes going to these shows well worth the effort to expose these folks to the additions the NMRA can add to the enjoyment of their hobby.

A reminder that our Regional Division Grant program is still very much alive and we are now looking at a new year. To briefly recap, the Region will match funds spent by Divisions (up to \$1000 combined) for money spent on new projects or events designed to attract new members and/or increase member retention levels for our current members. All it takes is a good idea. If you think of a project for your Division, discuss it with your Division Superintendent or Director to have it written up and submitted to our Grant Program chairman, Don Fowler, for Board approval.

The two big Pacific Southwest Region events on the near Horizon are the "mini" Convention (I know, I'm not supposed to use that term--sorry, too late) held in conjunction with the Cajon Division winter meet most years and the Los Angeles Division sponsored Regional Convention held in September. This year the Cajon meet and PSR Board meeting will be held in La Quinta, CA near Palm Springs and Palm Desert on March 27-29.

The event committee has rounded up a great venue (La Quinta Senior Center) and a really nice hotel / rate for those wanting to stay over Friday or Saturday night. See the Flyer on the Cajon Web Site for more specific information. If you sign up early you are automatically entered into an Arnie's Trains gift certificate raffle, so don't wait.

The LA Division is at full steam getting ready for our Regional Convention is September. They have a great program put together with a bunch of all new Clinics, Tours and the usual fun Train stuff. The convention hotel is in Van Nuys and is a really nice venue next to the Van Nuys Airport. Several "Make and Take" clinics are on the schedule including an extended start-to-finish completed and painted structure. Finally, after several years of PSR Board of Directors conversations and discussions, the drive toward incorporation of the Pacific Southwest Region as a Federal and State recognized non-profit 501(c)(3) corporation is now officially underway. NMRA National has been incorporated for many years but has failed and has given up on trying to umbrella its Regions, siting corporation complexity as the reason. Following a definitive final negative response from the NMRA legal counsel at the Convention in Utah, we are pursuing full PSR Regional incorporation independently. The process is expected to take 5-7 months with no major problems anticipated. We hope to announce its completion at the Convention in September and expect to see future payback in the form of reduced event venue costs for all of our Divisions, increased donation response due to legal tax benefits for donors as well as increased legal protection for all of our members officiating in Pacific Southwest Region NMRA events. This incorporation is designed to umbrella all of our four Divisions operating as the single PSR corporation reducing the yearly maintenance requirements while allowing each Division to continue operating independently as they have with minimal to no changes required. More information will be forthcoming as the process progresses.

Pete had said from the start that his attendance was conditional. My thanks to Pete for considering being our speaker.

The bigger and better news is that **Joe Fugate**, publisher of **Model Railroad Hobbyist Magazine**. has agreed to speak at our awards banquet. **Joe Fugate** has been an avid model railroader since getting his first train set at age 8. Joe has written about his hobby since the 1990s and started his own model railroad publishing business in 2004. Since 2009 Joe has been the Publisher of **Model Railroad Hobbyist Magazine** and often shares his extensive hobby expertise through magazine articles in MRH magazine, as well as in books and videos. Joe also models the SP Siskiyou Line in HO and his layout continues to fuel his passion for doing the hobby. I am pleased to welcome Joe to our convention.

At this point I would like to share an overview of the convention schedule with you:



"Young Kids and Model Railroad Layouts"

For the last decade or more, those in Model Railroading have been discussing the problem of attracting the younger generations to the joys of Model Railroading. Our competition has been the growing video and computer industries which have saturated the markets for leisure activities. These industries seem to have the upper hand at this point. However, with our museum quality layouts, which include fixed details, I sometimes think that we fail to display the fun of model railroading in a format which young children, ages 2+ to 11 or so, can enjoy.

Many "experienced" Model Railroaders remember the first Lionel or Marx trains that they had growing up. In my case my father and cousin banned me from the basement for several weeks in December as they were working on something that I couldn't see. That something tumed out to be a 4 x 6 foot Marx Train Layout complete with a farm and farm animals and green grass and a Marx Passenger train. That was my first train and it was a nice layout with one MAJOR flaw. All of the buildings and people and vehicles were glued down to the board!!! The first thing I did, after I learned how to operate the train, which ran around one loop, was to pry everything I could off of the board so that I could move the pieces around. Now with my knight figures and cowboy figures and army men free, I could have fun in my own way.

Fast forward to now. I have a large HO layout in my garage complete with buildings, people and lots of vehicles. While the people are glued down, all of the vehicles are NOT. Since I was part of the construction industry I also collected quite a few pieces of metal and plastic HO Scale construction equipment. An open spot near the edge of the layout provided a location for a concrete plant with an attached construction equipment yard.

I have two grandsons, ages $7\frac{1}{2}$ and $2\frac{1}{2}$ years old, who regularly spend time at our house. In addition to my HO and G gauge layouts, my house is filled with wooden and battery operated Thomas trains. Thank you Thomas!!! My older grandson operates my layouts as well as playing with the other trains.

His favorite spot on my layout is the Construction Equipment yard. Often, after running the trains at my house for a period, he will hand me the controller and go over to the construction equipment and start moving them and other vehicles around the layout. His younger brother, who loves to push the buttons on an MRC Sound Station controller, has recently discovered that he can move a step stool over

My 4 month old granddaughter, who lives in another state, already has a plastic Thomas set at my house waiting for her first birthday. Hopefully Thomas will take the place of a pink Lionel train.

As they get older I hope I can interest them to move away from Thomas and get interested in the more complex aspects of the hobby such as model building and operations and keep my rolling stock moving for generations to come.

As a member of a modular group that uses the same DCC system as I have, my older grandson often operates my trains at the shows that he attends. He is very proud of his "Junior Engineer" club badge that he wears at the shows.





Well if you are a member for more than just social interaction you most likely have completed some requirements for the NMRA Awards Program. If you have questions about the program just check with your division AP Manager at one of your division meets or call them. Did you know at the last several PSR Conventions there has been a clinic on the NMRA Awards Program were you have a chance to talk one on one with someone who can give you detailed information on the program and answer any questions you may have. This clinic will be given again at Van Nuys in September 2020.

Remember some of the Award Categories do not even require you to be a model builder, Chief Dispatcher, Model Railroad Author, Association Volunteer, and Association Official, just require a little of your time, or write a few articles. Yes, there is some paperwork but do not over think it

Now if you enjoy building models there are 7 categories available to you; Cars, Motive Power, Prototype Models, Structures, Scenery, Civil Engineer and Electrical Engineer. If you have a layout you have probably already completed most of the work. Remember you DO NOT, have to be a world class accomplished modeler. The Awards Program is designed for average modeling skills. For a Merit Award all you have to score is 87.5 points out of possible 125 points. And remember only half of the models for Cars, Structures and Motive Power need to be scratch built


Again, do not over think the requirements. You can get a Merit Award with a modified kit model. Yes, it takes more than just putting the kit together but heck that is part of the fun making the model your own by changing it. And we are not looking for a book on how you built the model just a few short paragraphs will do.

Acceptance of entries into the Show Room will begin on Wednesday, September 9th and continue until noon Friday, September11th. This will allow Merit Evaluations and tabulation of popular votes to be performed Friday afternoon. Viewing of entries and casting of popular votes will be available Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.
